He said the trailer was small and he would feel better with us there. He drove us to his parents place helped us to unload and made sure we felt at home before he left.

To sum this man up we moved up here to this small community never expecting to get what Ripon schools had to offer. What we recieved from this community and Mr Dutton cannot be measured with money, buildings or numbers. We recieved from him on that night and many other times a degree of kindness and caring that you cannot buy.
